You can only access it for a total of 6 months from the publisher's website and there is no way to download a local copy of it to read on a kindle or other e-reader that I can find. You have to view it on the website, so no reading on the subway or anywhere without cell service or wi-fi. And again, you only gain access to the ebook for a total of 6 months, so if you are buying this for personal enjoyment or for work and not for a class, you'd better hope you have time to take advantage of the ebook before it expires.
