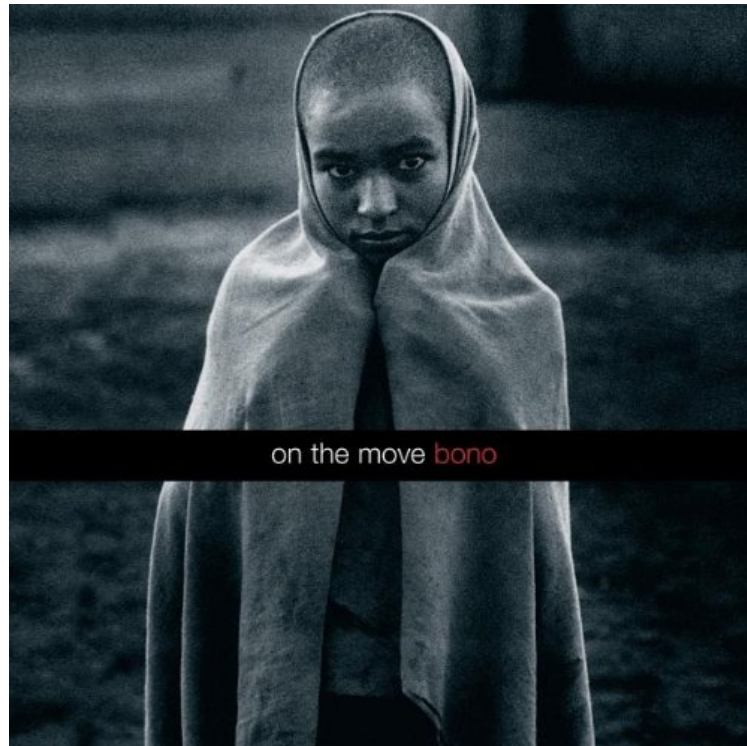

The speech lists twice, the first time, in short segments with pictures, and the second, as complete text, with no pictures.I'm leading a weekly discussion at my church, on Poverty, Justice, and the Bible. "On The Move" was quoted in one of my resources, and I bought a handful to share with the group. Since then, they have been made available to the entire congregation. All we ask, is that, after they are finished, they pass on the book to someone else.The photos are of people in Africa, but they could be anywhere.
