Fernand Braudel writes history in way that makes you want to stay with it and learn. He does not use, what I call, "the dissertation". Filled with footnotes, dry, useless cross-references and on and on.This book was filled with information that I WANTED to learn due to his style. It is a bit like watching a documentary on Ancient Egypt, but not getting the same old info on Pharaohs, but instead, getting information on the regular man in the street.This particular book of Mr Braudel focuses on the Med world of 400 years ago. It goes back to Homer and yet reaches the 20th century. Like the example I made above about Egypt, Mr Braudel doesn't focus on wars or treaties, nor does he mythologize about Gods and Goddesses, his attention focuses more on the everyday life. Such as how long it took for a cargo ship to work its way around the Med or how much it cost to send someone or something from place to place.
